As we start our twentieth year, Billerica Cat Care Coalition (BCCC) is proud to share with you the success we have achieved helping feral and abandoned cats and kittens, as well as cat and kitten owners, thanks to your generosity. We have been busy helping cats and kittens in need in various communities. And, as always, we continue to help injured cats in need.

#### Sadly, once we find them, many of these cats have serious need for veterinary care.

Winnie and her 4 siblings came to BCCC from a trapper who got them from a truck yard in Lynn, MA. She and her littermates received their proper exams, vaccinations and tests. All was going well until, one night in her foster care, it was noticed Winnie was not breathing correctly. In fact she was going into respiratory failure.

She was rushed to the emergency room vet hospital, whose staff fought to save her life. Winnie had deep pneumonia, along with unknown infections that caused her lungs to be on the verge of collapsing. She spent the next 4 days and nights in an oxygen incubator with aroundthe-clock, 24 hour vet care and intravenous meds to help her breathe and recover. Fortunately, Winnie did recover and later was adopted into her forever home (as were her siblings). A happy (and very expensive) ending for Winnie!

#### BCCC helps cats and kittens get well and have a great life!

Jetson and his littermates were brought to BCCC from a hoarding house underweight and suffering from multiple parasites and upper respiratory infections. A few days after arriving, Jetson was struggling to breathe and took a trip to the vet. But, as his littermates started to show improvement with antibiotics, antiparasitics and time, Jetson's condition worsened and he continued to lose weight. His breathing and hunger drive did not show improvement, despite multiple trips to different vets and strong antibiotics and antivirals.

BCCC brought Jetson to a specialty feline veterinarian who put him under anesthesia, flushed his sinus cavity and with a closer exam found a large polyp in the back of his mouth, which was removed. Jetson's turnaround was almost immediate. Just a couple weeks after surgery, Jetson joined his forever family. It took 4 months, numerous trips to multiple vets, countless medications and the devotion of foster families, but Jetson was finally home.

There are many cats who had serious health issues that we helped.
